

THE ARMENIAN COMMUNITY IN ISTANBUL AND CRISIS FACING THE PATRIARCHATE



A DISCUSSION WITH DR. OHANNES KILIÇDAĞI

Turkish authorities have canceled elections for the Armenian Patriarchate of Turkey effectively displacing the elected Locum Tenens-caretaker cleric or *deghabagh*-Archbishop Karekin Bekjdian of the Diocese of Germany. The move has drawn a fierce reaction from the Armenian community.

DR. OHANNES KILIÇDAĞI will examine the government's effort to usurp rights and erode the democratic governance of the community and its ties with the patriarchate. This is a rare opportunity to better understand challenges faced by Armenians in Turkey and their struggle to maintain institutions that are responsive and accountable to the community.
