Dr. Melissa Moreton is a scholar of medieval and early modern manuscripts and works at the Hill Museum and Manuscript Library, furthering the library's mission of the global preservation of endangered manuscripts, digital humanities leadership, scholarly and public outreach.

For more than five decades the Hill Museum and Manuscript Library [HMML], based in Minnesota, has been engaged in the work of photographically preserving Armenian manuscripts in libraries around the globe. HMML's current collection includes over 5,000 Armenian manuscripts in digital and microfilm form, which documents collections in Turkey, Syria, Iraq, Lebanon, and Europe. Dr. Moreton's talk will provide an introduction to HMML's global digitization efforts, highlight the library's Armenian manuscript projects, and explore some of these manuscripts on their digital platform, vHMML.org.
